


All teachers at EWPS provide explicit language teaching





What is screen time?

Screen time is the amount of time spent watching a screen or electronic media for entertainment. It includes:













Watching DVDs & other online shows



games on consoles, computers and mobile phones

Playing



Screen time does not include time spent on educational activities, such as for school work.

What is the right amount of screen time?

Health experts suggest these screen time limits:

Ages No 0-2 Screen time
